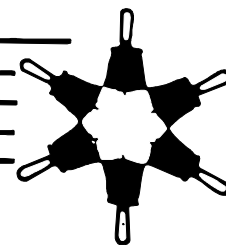




HANDBELL RINGERS OF GREAT BRITAIN

Honoured Members

The South East region would like to acknowledge the contribution of members who have given exceptional service to the South East region Handbell Ringers.

For those considering nominating someone for this award we set out some guidelines below:

- **Involvement in the development and promotion of handbell ringing**
- **Contribution in the organisation of ringing events**
- **Presenting workshops within the region to enable ringers to improve their ringing or learn new techniques**
- **Taking handbell ringing into the wider community and involving non-ringers**
- **Representing the region at a national or international level**
- **Raising significant monies for donation to charities through handbells**
- **Long term service to the region e.g. work on the committee**
- **Loaning equipment (bells, music....) for regional use**
- **Regular work with young ringers**

The above is neither exhaustive nor prescriptive and all nominations will be carefully considered.

Notes for Guidance

1. Nominees for the title of Honoured Member must be fully paid up members of Handbell Ringers of Great Britain.
2. The title of Honoured Member will be conferred upon individual members.
3. The number of honours given each year will be flexible and not limited.
4. Nominations may be made by any SE Region HRGB member and duly seconded but must be made without the knowledge of the nominee to avoid embarrassment.
5. All nominations should be submitted to the Regional Secretary and supported by an information sheet (see over).
6. The Regional Committee will be advised of nominations at the January committee meeting after which they will be considered.
7. Nominees will only be officially advised after a decision has been made and only then asked whether they would be happy to receive the award.
8. The award will be presented at the SE Region AGM.
9. The successful nominees will receive a suitable certificate. Recipients of the award will have their names inscribed on a Regional Roll of Honour and published in the Newsletter and website.

NB All reference to handbells includes handchimes and/ or belleplates

Nominations should include the name of the member and team/s together with background information and reasons why the nomination is being put forward. This background information should be no longer than an A4 sheet of paper.
